Guest Speaker

Today's guest speakers are Bill McQuire and Laurie Bromley, retired Air Traffic Controllers (ATC) who worked for 30+ years doing shift work at Sydney airport and have known each other since 1966.

The presentation will be about the different areas in Air Traffic Control, where the controllers are responsible for getting the planes in the air and to land safely. There will be a slide show. Bill and Laurie are happy for you to ask questions during and after the presentation.

Bill and Laurie gave us a lot of information about life as an Air Traffic Controller, which included studying to be an ATC, the different areas they worked in, shift work and terminology. The slide show included the various sections required to safely get the planes airborne and to land the planes. Laurie gave examples of speaking to the pilots in a way that explained such tasks as using the runways for take off and landing. Thoroughly enjoyable and educational.
