On the table there is also a "suggestion box". Your comments and suggestions are always welcome.



The movie is a powerful biopic of war photojournalist Lee Miller, played superbly by Kate Winslett. It starts with an interview being given to a young man in 1977 & flashes back to her life between 1938-1945.

She begins work as a fashion photographer for Vogue, London, but after World War 2 begins she pushes hard to get to the war zones, a nearly impossible feat for a woman, but she finally achieves her aim to photograph and give a true depiction of the horrors of war from the battles and terrible resulting injuries. the final to absolutely shocking atrocities of the nazi death camps.

The film captures not only the devastating things she witnessed but also the high emotional toll they took on her. Her personality throughout is hard driven and often impulsive and she copes through chain smoking and with alcohol, but also with the ongoing alliance of a photographer, David Scherman, from New York "Life" magazine who travels with her.

"Vogue", London found her photos too graphically shocking to publish but "Vogue", New York, did so to prove the truth.

Everyone was very glad to have seen the movie.



Letter to the Editor

I was very impressed with Andrew's presentation at our last meeting. Thank you, Cherry, for locating a very interesting speaker on Hearing and Brain Health. I would like to elaborate a little further as to the availability of concessional hearing services through Hearing Australia. Hearing Australia work in conjunction with Australian Government Hearing Services.

Should you come under any of the following categories, it may be of benefit to contact either Hearing Australia or Australian Government Hearing Services:-

- Pensioner Concession Card Holders
- D.V.A. Gold Repatriation Health Card
- Recipients of Sickness Allowance from Centrelink
- Members of Australian Defence Forces.

(Note: A Commonwealth Services Health Card does not provide eligibility for the hearing services programme.)

By contacting either of these agencies, and you are eligible, hearing devices, such as hearing aids and/or cochlear implants, may entitle you to obtain these devices, free of charge, and/or, purchase at a reduced rate. All audiologists at Hearing Australia, are fully qualified in their field and do not work on commissions and the like.

On a personal note, before I was informed about Hearing Australia, I had spent up to \$12,000 on three different sets of hearing aids, all were not suitable for my condition.

Over the past 7 years, I have been with Hearing Australia for my one hearing aid, and Cochlear Australia for my cochlear. I have not been asked to contribute to any financial payment towards these devices.

Should you wish to speak with me on a confidential basis to find out more, let me know at one of our next meetings.






















TOURS AND OUTINGS

BANANA CABANA PRIMATE SANCTUARY

This is a 3 hour tour of the sanctuary including High Tea

For 40 years Banana Cabana has been home to many monkeys retiring from Fauna Parks, Circus's, Research Facilities and private ownership.

We hope visitors to our Sanctuary will understand our residents may not be overly active, or looking quite as good as they did in their younger years, but they have done their bit in their former careers to educate and entertain us and can now sit back and enjoy retirement in a tranquil and peaceful environment. At Banana Cabana we do not breed or trade animals, nor do we purposely seek to acquire monkeys of a different species to enhance our collection. Our monkeys stay with us for the rest of their lives, and we commit to providing the ultimate for each of them as an individual.

In consideration of our monkeys, we limit the days and times our Sanctuary accepts guests, and every guest is always accompanied by a qualified keeper.

Your support in visiting our Sanctuary is truly, sincerely, appreciated, and enables us to continue to care for our beautiful residents.

Visitors experience a fully escorted keeper tour and personal introduction to each of our residents. Keepers provide guests with information about each monkey's unique history, the natural history and current conservation status of the species and the extraordinary ethnoornithological connection between human and non-human primates.

Visitors can hand feed some of the monkeys through the wire and are invited after the tour to relax with complementary light refreshments (tea/coffee/soft drinks/biscuits/scones etc.) overlooking the Sanctuary and gardens.

Sydney GPO Martin Place Sydney



Thursday 6th February 2025

Discover the rich history of the former Sydney General Post Office building with our resident guide on the GPO Heritage Tour.

The Sydney General Post Office (GPO) was constructed in two stages, beginning in 1866 and designed under the guidance of colonial architect James Barnet. It was regarded as a building which would come to symbolise Sydney in the same way the Houses of Parliament in Westminster represent London and the Eiffel Tower, Paris.

On September 1, 1874, the first stage of the GPO was opened, and Sydney was mesmerised by the first major building development in Sydney. In 1891, the clock tower was finally completed, and the bells rang out across Sydney for the first time.

Delve into the vibrant history and culture of Sydney's former GPO and let our resident tour guide bring you on a journey through time on the GPO Heritage Tour, to discover the stories, tales and legends of the city's iconic Grand Dame.

The Purified Recycled Water Discovery Centre is located next to the Quakers Hill Water Resource Recovery Facility (previously known as Wastewater Treatment Plant). Here, wastewater is tertiary treated before it is returned to the environment or enters the Discovery Centre.

The Discovery Centre opens to the community for tours in 2024. What to wear and bring

You must wear sturdy, fully enclosed, flat soled shoes (no open toes shoes such as sandals, thongs, ballet flats, or heels). Long pants are preferred.

Safety glasses will be provided for a section of the tour, if you have your own you may wish to bring them.

Please bring a bottle of water with you. You can refill this on site. How to get there

Address: 240 Quakers Road, Quakers Hill

Continue straight to Gate 1 'Welcome to the Purified Recyled Water Discovery Centre'.

Press and hold the intercom button located on the right side of the road and a Community Education Officer will open the gate.

Enter through the gate and park in the first car park on the right, opposite the Purified Recycled Water Discovery Centre.



In the next 30 years to 2022 618,810 wraps were made and distributed throughout the world.

Then in 2023 a further 29,560 wraps were distributed to the following countries:

Armenia	3,625
Australia	10,951
Ethiopia	250
Fiji	100
Philippines	2,430
Syria	6,062
Turkiye	3,761
Ukraine	2,032
Vanuatu	279
Zimbabwe	70
Total	<u>29,560</u>

The wraps distributed in Australia went to women's refuges, nursing homes, organisations supporting refugees, bundles for new-born babies, organisations working with indigenous communities, and communities in need.
